It may be that this is a great opportunity for an aspiration visit, or it may be we utilise your offer to run something enriching for a class in school. Depending on what you can offer, you may complete a Casual Volunteer form or an Aspiration Volunteer form.
I'd like to become a regular vol- unteer	Regular volunteers are those who can commit to a regular, usual- ly weekly, visit to school. We ask regular volunteers to support our pupils with opportunities to read with an adult, build confi- dence with an area of the curriculum they're finding challenging or to enable us to stretch and challenge pupils beyond the class- room. We do ask for references and further information initially to set up regular volunteers. If this is something you can offer, please complete a Regular Volunteer form.
