## Pupil Premium Funding Financial Year 2014-2015

Pupil Premium funding is allocated to schools to support children of statutory school age from low income families, who are known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM), to children who have been looked after in the care of the Local Authority, for more than six months and to children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

Schools are free to spend Pupil Premium funding as they see fit. However, schools are accountable for how this additional funding is used to support the appropriate pupils. Schools are required to publish this information online, to ensure that parents and others are made aware of the extra support provided in school and the impact that this has on the attainment of pupils covered by the funding.

At Broughton Fields Pupil Premium is used in the following ways:

- To provide targeted support, for example, Every Child Counts, Better Readers, 1:1 Read Write Inc and intervention groups by teaching assistants.
- To provide extended school support, for example, residential visits.
- To enrich the curriculum, for example, curriculum workshops, subsidised visits (including swimming).
