**Year 3**  
YHA Oxford  
Cotswold Wildlife Park & The Story Museum, Oxford



We stay in a YHA Youth Hostel in the centre of Oxford. On the way to the hostel we stop at the Cotswold Wildlife Park where we spend the day finding out about all the animals and birds. Once we leave the wildlife park we head to the Youth Hostel.

Upon arrival the children are shown their rooms. They will either stay in large dormitories or in smaller rooms with bunk beds. They will make their beds



(bedding is provided) and make themselves at home before having tea which is served in the dining room at the centre.

The following morning, after breakfast, the children strip their beds and pack their things before we leave for The Story Museum to participate in workshops and activities. After this we move on to Bella Italia for a 3 course lunch before heading back to school.



**Year 4**  
Bushcraft Company—Cuffley, Hertfordshire

This is a new trip for this year as our previous destination was becoming too expensive. We are excited about the opportunities Cuffley will offer.



The group will leave early on Monday morning and head to the camp site in Cuffley Woods. The children will be immersed in nature, engaging in new activities and developing their personal skills and making memories. Activities for the stay will include low ropes, problem solving and

camouflage and concealment. Their first activity will be building and lighting a fire!



The children will sleep in large safari bell tents and have use of other larger structures to keep them warm and dry.

The children will have all their meals provided to them in the newly refurbished refractory will a menu of fresh and locally sourced ingredients.



**Year 5**  
Isle of Wight, Hampshire



This will be our fourth year visiting the Isle of Wight. Children will be taken by coach to the South Coast where they will catch the ferry to the island where they will stay at the Bernay Hotel in Sandown. During the week the children will visit lots of local attractions including: Osborne House, Robin Hill Country Park, The Needles, Blackgang Chine, and Carisbrooke Castle and, of course, the beach! The coach that collects the children from school will remain with them for the duration of the visit and will transport them between locations. All

food will be provided except for lunch on the first day. We had nothing but positive feedback from the children that attend the Isle of Wight trip each year and we are sure that this year will be no exception!

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**Year 6**  
Bushcraft Company, Boughton Woods, Northamptonshire

We will be visiting a new activity centre this year near Kettering. We have chosen to change location due to increasing costs at the site we have used for the past couple of years. At this site, the children will be given the chance to become adventurers in the wilderness!



We will depart early in the morning and arrive on site by 9am. The children's first task will be setting up camp including the camp

The children will also learn to cook on an open fire. These activities are designed to enhance social and personal development whilst having fun and learning new skills.
