

English:

Next half term, the children will be focusing their learning on the story 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell. Throughout the half term, the



children's learning will be based around the story in which they will complete a range of activities to support their knowledge of the story.

The children will learn to recite the story by orally retelling and acting out. The children will then innovate the story to create their own version using different woodland creatures.

Your child will also continue to invent their own stories by creating story maps to support oral retelling of made up stories.

You can help by supporting them to retell the story.

Maths:

In Maths, the children will begin to explore division as sharing before understanding doubling and halving.

The children will be learning to solve mathematical problems, in which your child will need to demonstrate their understanding of these skills.

Later on in the term, the children will explore measurement. Your child will be learning all about measuring length, time and money.

You can support your child at home by beginning to tell the time and teaching them to recognise coins.



PE

We recommend that all children continue to have their PE kits in school from Monday to Friday, in case we need to change the timetable.

For health and safety reasons, it is important that all children wear the correct clothing for PE and jewellery is kept to one pair of studs only, which will be covered by tape. If your child gets distressed by having their earrings covered by tape, please remove their earrings on PE days.

Please ensure that **all** school uniform and PE kit is labelled with your child's name.

The children have been reassessed and organised into new groups for after the

Christmas holidays. Some children will begin to read some longer texts during these Read, Write, Inc sessions as well as continuing to use their phonic knowledge to read and spell common words.

At home, continue to support your child by reading with them every day as well as practising their letter formation of the sounds. Remember to complete your child's reading record when you read with them at home.
