Summer 1 Topic - Food Glorious Food

English

Year 1 will be learning the story of Handa's surprise. The children will adapt the story to continue to develop their story telling skills and then plan and write their own journey story.

Year 2 will be learning the story of Traction Man, which is the story of a superhero who saves and defeats random household equipment. The children will be innovating the story before writing their own superhero themed story.

Maths

Year 1 will continue securing their knowledge of place value of numbers up to 100 and learning about how to use them in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations. The children will also be learning how to measure weight and volume accurately.

Year 2 will be revising the Key Stage One Maths curriculum in preparation for their SATs. The children will be problem solving using addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Computing

Both Year 1 and 2 will be using the laptops to develop their word processing skills. The children

will be learning about the different programs they can use for word processing as well as other programs, such as how to create images using Paint.



Science

In Year 1, the children will be learning about seasonal change and how the environment changes during each of the four seasons.

Year 2, will be further investigating materials through continued discussions of their properties and how materials can be changed.

Geography

In Geography, both Year 1 and Year 2 will be learning about where food comes from, how it travels around the world and why certain foods are grown in specific countries.

We are hoping to arrange a visit to Tesco, so we can learn more about food and where it comes from. As well as the different types of food and how they are stored ready to be sold to the public.

We will end the topic learning about the journey of a cocoa bean and the process it goes through from growing to making a chocolate bar.
