Autumn 2 Topic: Amazing Animals

English

Year 1:

The children will continue using Talk 4 Writing strategies to learn the story of 'Farmer Duck'. The children will then innovate and invent their own versions choosing their own 'Amazing Animal' characters

Year 2

The children will be basing their writing on the text 'Meerkat Mail'. The children will be changing the characters and using their geographical knowledge to explore different habitats in their innovated stories.

Maths

Year 1:

The children will continue developing their place value knowledge of numbers to 20 and developing strategies to solve addition and subtraction calculations with numbers up to 20.

Year 2:
